ENGLISH

1. "Create Your Himalayan Travel Badge"

The Mountain Council wants to give you a special "Himalayan Explorer Badge." Design your own badge using symbols of the Greater Himalayas (snow peaks, glaciers, animals, or trees). Also write 5-8 sentences explaining why you chose those symbols and what they say about the Great Himalayas. A Day in the Greater Himalayas – My Adventure Essay.

2. Imagine you spend one whole day in the Himalayas. Write an essay describing your adventure. Include what you saw, how the mountains looked, whom you met (animals, travelers, or even talking mountains!), and how you felt being surrounded by snow-covered peaks.

MATHS

TOPIC "Himalayan Peak Height"

Task:

1. Choose any 5 Himalayan peaks (e.g., Everest, K2, Kanchenjunga, Nanda Devi, and Annapurna).
• Find out their height.

Out of the five Himalayan peaks you selected,

- Write the name of the highest peak.
- Write the name of the lowest peak.
- Find the difference in their heights.

2. Arrange in Ascending/Descending Order

Arrange the heights of the five peaks in:

- (a) Ascending order (smallest to tallest)
- (b) Descending order (tallest to smallest)

SCIENCE

Topic: Himalayan Plants & Animals

1. On a scrapbook, make a list of:

- a. Any 3 plants found in the Himalayas (e.g., Pine, Fir, Rhododendron)
- b. Any 3 animals (e.g., Snow Leopard, Yak, Himalayan Monal)

2. Write about their:

- a. Habitat
- b. Adaptations
- c. One interesting fact

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SOCIAL STUDIES

Make a Scrapbook on the Himalayas with pictures, drawings, and short notes about:

- The three Himalayan ranges (Greater, Middle, Shivalik)
- Famous peaks (Mount Everest, Kanchenjunga, etc.)
- Any two important rivers originating from the Himalayas
- Two states of India which are a part of The Great Himalayas
